Recently, WNV was detected in snakes , and antibodies against WNV were found in farmed crocodiles (*Crocodylus niloticus*) in Israel and Mexico and in alligators (*Alligator mississippiensis*) in the United States . Moreover, a severe outbreak of WNV neurologic disease in farmed alligators was reported in Florida .

West Nile Virus in Farmed Crocodiles, Zambia, 2019 ...

In 1984, the disease reappeared on the same farm but was considerably less severe and caused fewer deaths. More recently a virus has been found in association with pathological conditions of the liver and intestine of captive Nile crocodiles in Zimbabwe.

A crocodile farm or alligator farm is an establishment for breeding and raising of crocodylians in order to produce crocodile and alligator meat, leather from crocodile and alligator skin, and other goods.
