1. Introduction. Some of the major perspectives are; HRM or Strategic HRM. HRM and strategic HRM are considered identical and used interchangeably by some authors. For example, Mathis & Jackson (1985: 3-4) define HRM as “the strategic planning and management of human resources for an organization. HRM is more broadly focused and strategic”.
