How To Answer A Document Based Question

This exam consists of 55 multiple-choice questions, four short-answer questions, a longer essay with a choice of two prompts, and a special type of essay question: the Document Based Question, or DBQ.

How to Ace the DBQ on the AP US History Exam

Since the DBQ is the entire exam, the timing is a little different. You will have 45 minutes total to analyze documents and write your essay, and 5 minutes to upload your response. A good breakdown would be 15 min. (reading & analysis) + 30 min. (writing) = 45 min. + 5 min. (upload)

Proofreading: 10 Minutes Time management is essential for a successful grade in this form of examination. The general DBQ outline states that the duration is 3 hours and 15 minutes. Spend around 15 minutes planning, 2 hours and 45 minutes writing, and 10 minutes proofreading.

For the DBQ essay, you will be asked to analyze some historical issue or trend with the aid of the provided sources, or "documents," as evidence.

It requires a student's knowledge of a certain topic with evidence from around 3 to 16 reliable sources.

How To Answer Dbq Questions

To properly identify, you must provide 1-2 sentences where you directly answer the question, within the proper time period. When asked to explain, these responses often will be three sentences. One sentence to answer the question, and then two sentences to provide specific facts that support your answer.

If you're taking an AP exam, you'll have 45 minutes to write your DBQ essay. Times may vary in other settings but, in any case, plan out how much time you can spend on each section of your essay. Do your best to leave at least 2 or 3 minutes at the end to make revisions. If you have 45 minutes to write, take about 5 minutes to make an outline.

For a DBQ essay, you will receive several documents of varying length. You will be asked to respond to some historical prompt that will require you to use the documents as evidence in your response. The great thing about a DBQ is that a lot of information you need to answer the question is in the documents themselves - score!

Start with 20 minutes for your outline and 50 for your essay, (or longer, if you need). Then when you can do it in 20 and 50, move back to 18 minutes and 45 for writing, then to 15 and 40.
