To diagnose a staph infection, your doctor will: Perform a physical exam. During the exam, your doctor will closely examine any skin lesions you may have. Collect a sample for testing.

Methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus(MRSA) is associated with difficult-to-treat infections and high levels of morbidity. Manual practitioners work in environments where MRSA is a common

acquired infection.

Because of MRSA staph infection, doctors recommend the strongest antibiotic available in the market. The doctor takes the sample of the patient's infection and prepares a culture of it. Then he tries different antibiotics on it to test which antibiotic works better on that bacteria.

How to Treat Staphylococcus Aureus Infection - Health Hearty

Staphylococcal toxic shock syndrome may result from use of vaginal tampons or complicate any type of *S. aureus* infection (eg, postoperative wound infection, infection of a burn, skin infection). Although most cases have been due to methicillin-susceptible *S. aureus* (MSSA), cases due to MRSA are becoming more frequent.

For a bacterial staph infection (or any bacterial infection), a 7-10 day course of oral antibiotics or gel will do the trick. For recurrent yeast infections (either alone, or with a bacterial vaginitis), a great treatment for this is taking several doses of the medication Diflucan.

The bacterial density of *S. aureus* changes dramatically during menstruation, increasing logarithmically in the vagina compared to during nonmenses (31). A major end product of *Lactobacillus* metabolism, lactic acid, is responsible for maintaining the vaginal pH at approximately 4 at times other than menstruation (2, 14).
